

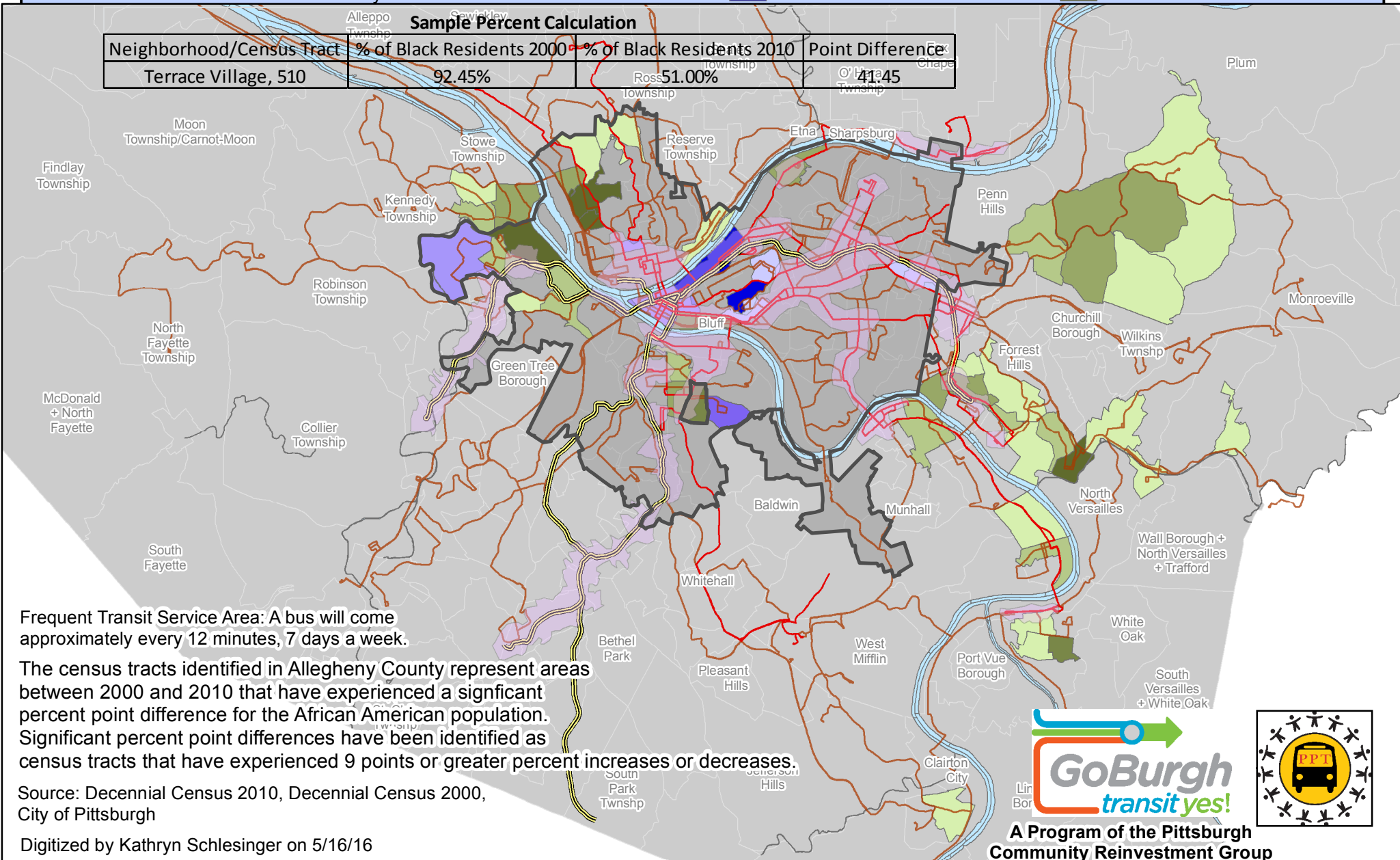
# African American Residents Moving from the City to the County Resulting in more Limited Transit Service Available

Frequent Transit Service Area: A bus will come approximately every 12 minutes, 7 days a week.

The census tracts identified in Allegheny County represent areas between 2000 and 2010 that have experienced a significant percent point difference for the African American population. Significant percent point differences have been identified as census tracts that have experienced 9 points or greater percent increases or decreases.
